Our SOFT coalition, comprised of representatives from all six parishes (Holy Family, Holy Guardian Angels, Sacred Heart, St. Aloysius, St. Boniface, and Visitation) has been focusing on

strategies to address the goals identified at the following levels:

Diocesan level (serving 38 counties in Central and Northern Missouri)

- *Co-Responsibility
- *Clergy Well-Being
- *Implementing the Stewardship Way of Life

Southeast Deanery level (27 parishes total); our Coalition (6 parishes)

- *Sacraments are Accessible and Celebrated Well
- *Hospitality
- *Fulfillment of the Mission (Stewardship)

Actions taken by the coalition in the above areas and items in the discussion/planning stage include:

Co-Responsibility/Clergy well-being

We are discussing with the 2 priests and 1 deacon in our coalition the possible transfer of appropriate responsibilities to laity and the process/training involved.

Sacraments are accessible / Celebrated well / Stewardship

The parish Stewardship Council is overseeing the stewardship renewal process for our parish in the areas of hospitality, service, prayer, and formation. Related to this effort, our SOFT coalition is checking into training for all Liturgical Ministers (extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, music ministers, etc.).

Hospitality

Laypersons play important roles before/during Mass. Some enhancements identified by the coalition include having laypersons:

- *be greeters at Masses; and,
- *provide, before Mass, a short introduction to the Mass and an acknowledgment/welcome to visitors.

A "welcome" pamphlet" that will be placed in the pews is also being designed at this time.
