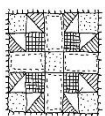

BREAKING THE SILENCE OF ABUSE

False allegations are very rare. Our initial response to someone who is disclosing abuse for the first time must be compassionate. This October, we will once again take an **attendance count** at all weekend Masses. This follows the directive of the Presbyteral Council, which approved a plan for counting attendance at its meeting on February 11, 2025. As noted in the minutes of that meeting:

“It was stated that all parishes would submit Mass attendance numbers for a period of one year, rotating every three years, and conduct the October count for the other years.”

Since our most recent attendance count spanned a full year, we will conduct the October count in both 2025 and 2026. The diocese will then resume a full 12-month count in **2027**.

October Birthright Collection

St. Anne’s Sodality is collecting for Birthright in October. Birthright has been helping women with unplanned pregnancies for over 50 years. Some of the items they need are winter coats/clothing size 0-2T, diapers size Preemie, Newborn, 4, 5, 6 and Pullups, baby care items and hygiene products for the mothers. They also accept new or gently used baby or maternity items. Please see the display of post-it notes on the cry-room window for suggested items needed. Donations should be left in the box at the back of church. If you would like to donate cash, please place it in an envelope marked “Birthright” and place it in the collection basket. ST. ANN’S SODALITY MEETING was held on September 8. In October, the sodality is coordinating a collection for Birthright. The Fatima Caring Closet collection has been extended into September. We thank parishioners for the many donations already received for Fatima Caring Closet and the Good Shepherd Center School’s Out collection in May. The sodality had two quilts in the 2025 picnic quilt auction. Katie’s Heirloom brought \$1,000 and was matched by Catholic Financial Life for \$600. The \$1,600 raised will be given to Sacred Heart School. Midnight Sampler brought \$1,800 which was matched by Western Catholic Union for \$300. The \$1,800 goes to the sodality and the \$300 match will be shared between the sodality and the Sacred Heart Quilting Club. We thank Carol and Sarah Siegler for supporting the sodality by donating the quilt top and the Sacred Heart Quilting Club for quilting the quilt. The sodality plans to sell religious articles at the parish Fall Festival. November 15-16 bake sales will be coordinated by Work Group 4. The next sodality meeting is scheduled for November 3, 2025, at 6:30 p.m. A Soup Supper will be held before the meeting at 6:00 p.m.
